As part of our annual allocation of funds, cheques were presented to **Ashmont Breakkie Club** and **Football4all.**

Ashmont Breakkie Club's representative, **Judy Heard** (*below left*) was delighted to accept our contribution to fund the breakfast program operating at Ashmont Public School on Tuesdays and Thursdays. This club is often confused with another group which provides breakfast on the other days of the week.





Judy explained that the breakkie club survives on donations from local people and businesses such as O'Brien's Wagga Hot Bake Bakery (Morgan Street) and Wagga Fruit Supply (Bardo Lane) and students from CSU vacating their accommodation at the end of their studies or over the holidays.

Judy recounted stories of children coming to school without having a meal the night before and often without lunch. The breakfast at school can be the only meal the children have in a day.

Luci Achilles (*bottom right*) was able to provide us first-hand information about the benefits her second son has experienced from continue play a team sport which met his needs. About 55 adults and children compete

Co-incidentally, Luci's eldest son was a member of the team of riders from Riding for Disabled who participated in the **Mounted Games** at the Royal Easter Show. He took out 3rd place.

The club has undertaken to sponsor the team for the next 3 years 2018-2020 inclusive.

The Mounted Games are aimed at being fun for horse and rider, while improving their co-ordination and confidence.



Mounted Games were the inspiration of H.R.H. Prince Philip who at the 1957 Horse of the Year competition asked if he could devise a competition for children who could not afford an expensive, well-bred pony.

This has been translated into RDA competition and the top events in NSW are the RDA (NSW) Mounted Games and Horse of the Year Championships held at the Annual Royal Easter Show in Sydney.

Riders participate in qualifying competitions at regional level to gain selection to compete in the State event.

There are a selection of sporting games and races that require and improve the agility of both horse and rider. Some of these games are the barrel race, the flag race and bending.
