

TODAY'S PROGRAM: PILATES Trish Donelly

Marilyn Walter introduced Trish, a local Pilates instructor.



Trish began with the story of Joseph Pilates, whose work with injured soldiers in hospitals in Germany during World War I inspired him to devise rehabilitation programs using exercises and machines.

His theme was "Movement is health and movement heals."

His focus was the enhancement of posture, strength and stability, so that practitioners could improve their range of movement and their core stability and balance through breathing and exercise, especially after injuries.

Trish gave us some practical activities (standing with and without using a chair for balance).

David Gilbey observed that whilst in Japan, he took part in the exercises which are broadcast early every morning to encourage fitness.

Jo Wilson thanked Trish, and observed that tai chi, yoga and Pilates all focus on the breath to calm the mind.

The Mounted Games are aimed at being fun for horse and rider, while improving riders' co-ordination and confidence.

Mounted Games were the inspiration of H.R.H. Prince Philip who at the 1957 Horse of the Year competition asked if he could devise a competition for children who could not afford an expensive, well-bred pony.



This has been translated into RDA competition and the top events in NSW are the RDA (NSW) Mounted Games and Horse of the Year Championships held at the Annual Royal Easter Show in Sydney.

Riders participate in qualifying competitions at regional level to gain selection to compete in the State event.

There is a selection of sporting games and races that require and improve the agility of both horse and rider. Some of these games are the barrel race, the flag race and bending.
